- At every stage, try to determine what you need to do to rise to the next level in your spiritual growth. Set specific goals for yourself.
- 7. Remember that no matter what spiritual heights you may reach there will always be room to grow some more.
- 8. Spiritual maturity carries with it the responsibility to be helpful to those who are less mature.
- 9. Take Jesus alone as your example to follow.
- 10. Keep your eyes fixed on the goal. Never look back.
