The night entailed dazzling scavenger hunts, light shows, corn mazes, food, and the traditional end-of-the-night movie at The Overland Park Cinemas.




































Spring intramurals included sports such as volleyball and soccer among others. The games were filled with competition and tons of laughter as the season proved successful.



















The team loses 4 seniors this year, but to come back to do just as well and better next year!





























THE PRESIDENT AND I: AN INTERVIEW WITH PRESIDENT ALEXANDER

Being the president of a university is a tough job. In many ways, it's the most difficult job on campus. The role requires someone that is willing to invest countless hours of their time into the school and its students. So much is expected from just one person that it takes a person as dedicated and selfless as Dr. David Alexander to do it.

Since being elected in 2008, Dr. Alexander has been serving the university with his encouraging words and kind spirit. He is a strong advocate for the NNU values of transformation, truth, service, and community. All six vice presidents and the athletic director report directly to Dr. Alexander. The rest of the professors and staff have other superiors that they report to.

Dr. Alexander's favorite aspect of being the president is all of the people he gets to work with, staff and student alike. "Each and every day I hear another story of how a student or a faculty member or university staff member has cared for someone or has expected something more out of a student than what they thought they were capable of...and they have a lightbulb moment where they realize 'I really can do this.' " The transformational aspect of NNU is what keeps Dr. Alexander going. Seeing a person's personal growth is an incredible encouragement.

This desire to see a change extends to the university as a whole. One of the most important things Dr. Alexander would like to see become stronger in the coming years is classes that will help students make important spiritual decisions. It's easy to associate these kinds of student-made decisions coming out of a Bible class, but he

wants students to have the opportunity to think about their own spiritual issues

in every class. "We have to provide curricular and cocurricular that foster spiritual formation." President Alexander was in college when he made the critical decision to follow Christ and believes that other students can use this crucial time of personal development to make that choice as well. Dr. Alexander was willing to admit that not every student would take advantage of this system and that everyone needs to make the choice if they want to just try out this "religion" thing or if they want to go in wholeheartedly.

As for the future of NNU, Dr. Alexander has a few plans set in motion that will hopefully come to fruition soon. "We're still in the process of becoming a university," said Alexander. "We'll continue to strengthen the undergraduate/residential experience and in addition to that, we'll continue to grow in our adult and graduate offerings." The options that are currently in the works include on-campus classes, but here is a big push for a more prominent online program.

Coming to college is arguably one of the biggest decisions a person can make, and Dr. Alexander talked about some of the advantages it can give to aspiring students. "College is a unique opportunity that a certain group of people have in the world to pause and to think deeply and to reflect and to learn in a concentrated time unlike any other time in their lives, "he explained. He went on to say that the kindergarten through 12th get to go off and explore on your own. This freedom allows the student to become who they truly want to be and customize their further education in the exact field that they want to delve in to.

NNU, he says, is designed "to help people find their sense of calling." Making money, although the primary reason for many to attend college at all, comes second to the fulfilled and satisfying life that they will develop on this campus. Statistics show that people that go to college make one million dollars more than those that don't, but President Alexander explains that it's not the only reason to go. It might be a nice additional bonus, but the personal changes and who a person becomes emotionally, spiritually, and even theologically are what matters at the end of the day. Jobs come and go; upstanding moral and spiritual character is what

lasts in the end, and Dr. Alexander recognizes that and encourages others to embrace a similar mentality.

When all is said and done, and we've all earned our million dollars, will we be able to say that we have the character to match that hefty sum? Dr. Alexander certainly hopes so and wishes to see this university flourish by serving and honoring God's kingdom.

KNOWING JESUS: DANNY ATKINS AND HIS MISSION FOR NNU

"What does it take to see it leave the walls of NNU?"

I recently met up with Campus Ministry Coordinator Danny Atkins to discuss his SGA position and his plans for this semester. It was a Thursday, less than a week before Winter Awakening was set to start and the day after the weekly Timeout - a busy time for the CMC. I had originally planned for this article to be almost exclusively on campus ministry, but what Danny had to say left me little choice – the focus should be on the man running the whole show. As the interview progressed, a question emerged: "What does it take to see it leave the walls of NNU?" This question will be my point of departure.

As you probably noticed, the question is missing a subject. So, what is this "it" that we are talking about? I will answer this question momentarily, but for the sake of comparison, let's substitute the word "skill" or better yet "brilliance" for "it". What does it take to see brilliance leave the walls of NNU? Forgoing the expulsion of brilliant individuals, it would take talented dedicated educators, bright dedicated students, and no small manner of hard work to see a true "brilliance" leave the walls of NNU. The question template could be applied to athletics as well. What would it take to see athletic excellence leave the walls of NNU? Not being a student athlete I speculate it takes athletes,

for one, and excellent coaching to guide them. In each case, a master/pupil, player/coach relationship is required. The same goes for the spiritual formation on this campus, which makes Danny Atkins our coach, of sorts.

The "it" in the question then might best be filled with this phrase from the NNU Mission Statement: creative and redemptive agent[s]. What does it take to see creative and redemptive agents leave the walls of NNU? This is the question Danny is trying best to answer. and the mission he is striving to fulfill. Coming from a very Christ-centered background - growing up in a church of 2, 000 and youth groups of hundreds - a Christian vision and worldview came naturally to Danny. He highlights his older brother, Young Life leader, and youth pastor as having key roles in his spiritual calling to lead. It began with reaching out to others in his high school that didn't know about Jesus's love, and after his mom heard a radio ad about a small school in Nampa, Idaho; it brought him to us. Peculiarly, NNU maybe wasn't everything Danny was looking for.

Coming out of high school, he was ready to serve. He was ready to leave because he wanted the Word to be heard. As he said to me with a grin though, and I paraphrase: NOBODY here HASN'T heard the Word of Christ. NNU offered him an alternative, and that was to grow instead.

"We have so many tools here to pursue our faith," he says and if we look beyond the walls of this school, and of our hearts, we can be the creative redemptive agents in this place here and now. Nampa has struggles. There are those who need to know the real Jesus. Wanting this campus to genuinely know Jesus might be Danny's unofficial mission statement. He references J.I. Packers book Knowing God for a definition of what truly knowing Him means, and points to a key passage that delineates from knowing of him, and knowing Him personally:

[T]he question is, can we say, simply, honestly, not because we feel that as evangelicals we ought to, but because it is plain matter of fact, that we have known God, and that because we have known God the unpleasantness we have had, or the pleasantness we have not had, through being Christians does not matter

to us.

Looking at Danny's position as Campus Ministry Coordinator, from my vantage point at least, he really is taking on the position with the highest calling for a student. He defines his position as a spiritual leader of the campus and a representative of the student body. This of course means so much more than those few words indicate. Like any position of leadership, it requires consistency and accountability; and with the added element of spirituality it also requires an unmatched authenticity. One would need to be a sort of superman to live out those virtues, and Danny is quick to point out that that is not him. In a year that he describes as "difficult," his relationship with Jesus has seen him through. Resting in the love of God and putting full dependence on His grace has led him through growing pains in the face of his own struggles and allowed him to be the spiritual leader this campus needs.

So what does it take to see it leave the walls of NNU?
