Argentina

Nine of ten people in Argentina say they are Christians; however, most of those admit to not practicing their faith. The background of the vast majority of Argentina's population is European (mainly of Spanish and Italian descent) and mestizo (a mixture of European and Amerindian). Argentina is considered a nation of immigrants, and they sometimes refer to themselves as a "crucible of races." The Church of the Nazarene began its work in Argentina in 1919. Located on the Cono-Sur (Southern Cone) Field of the South America Region, Argentina recently hosted the 2024 Global Theology Conference of the Church of the Nazarene, with theologians, educators, and church leaders from the six global regions participating.
