“Very well, he is in your hands; but you must spare his life,” replied God.

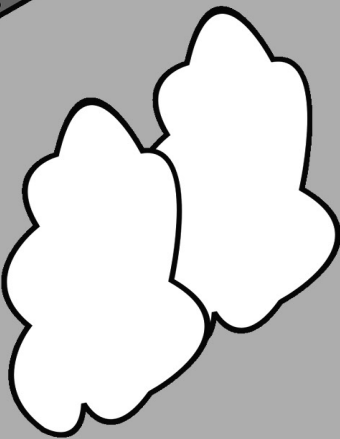
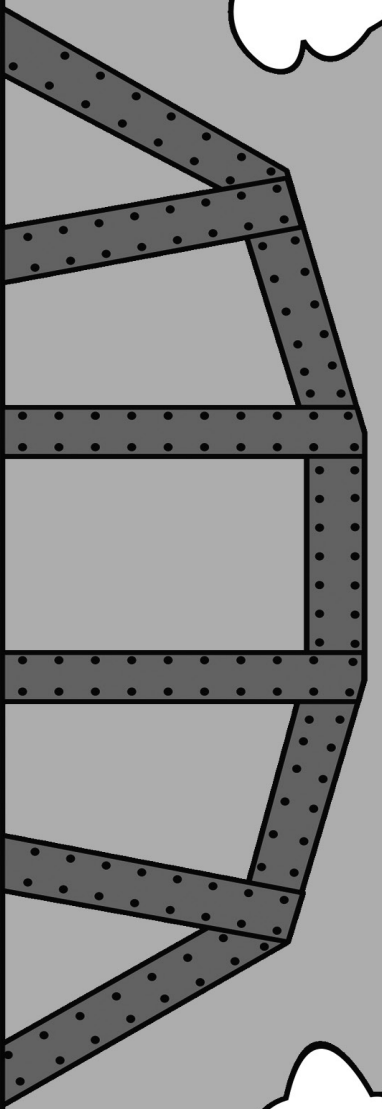
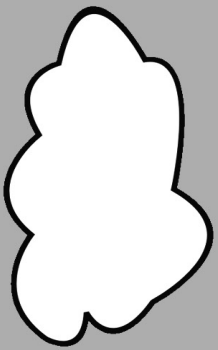
So Satan covered Job’s whole body with sores. Then Job sat on ashes and all day he scratched himself with a piece of pottery.

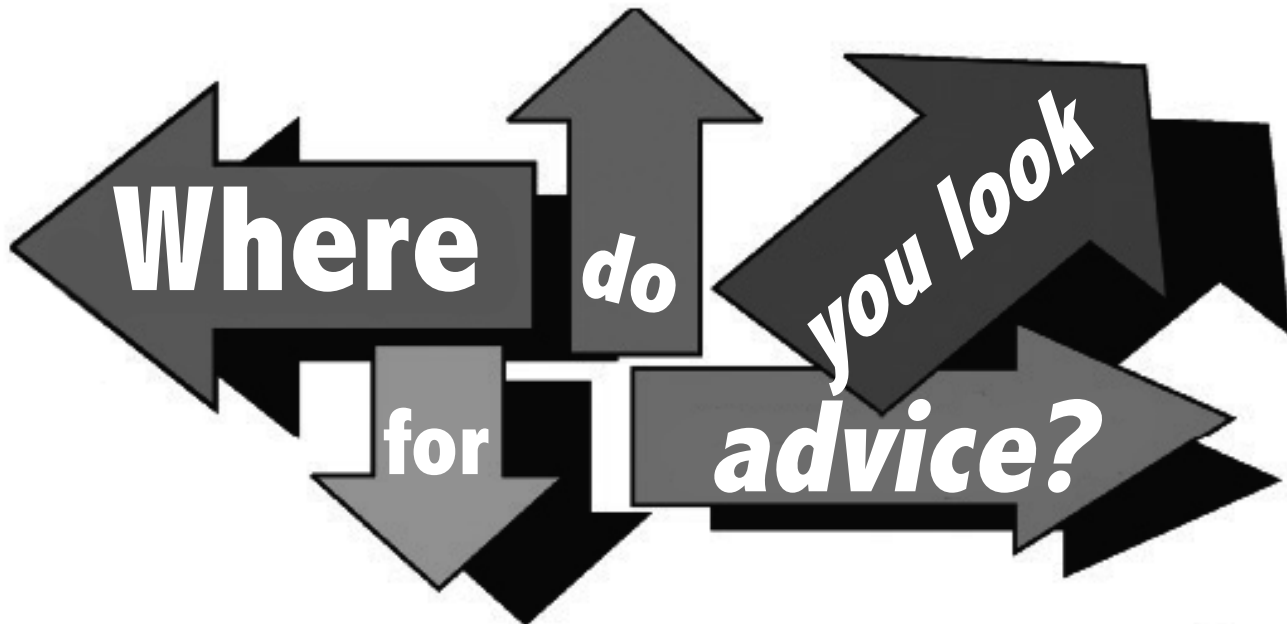

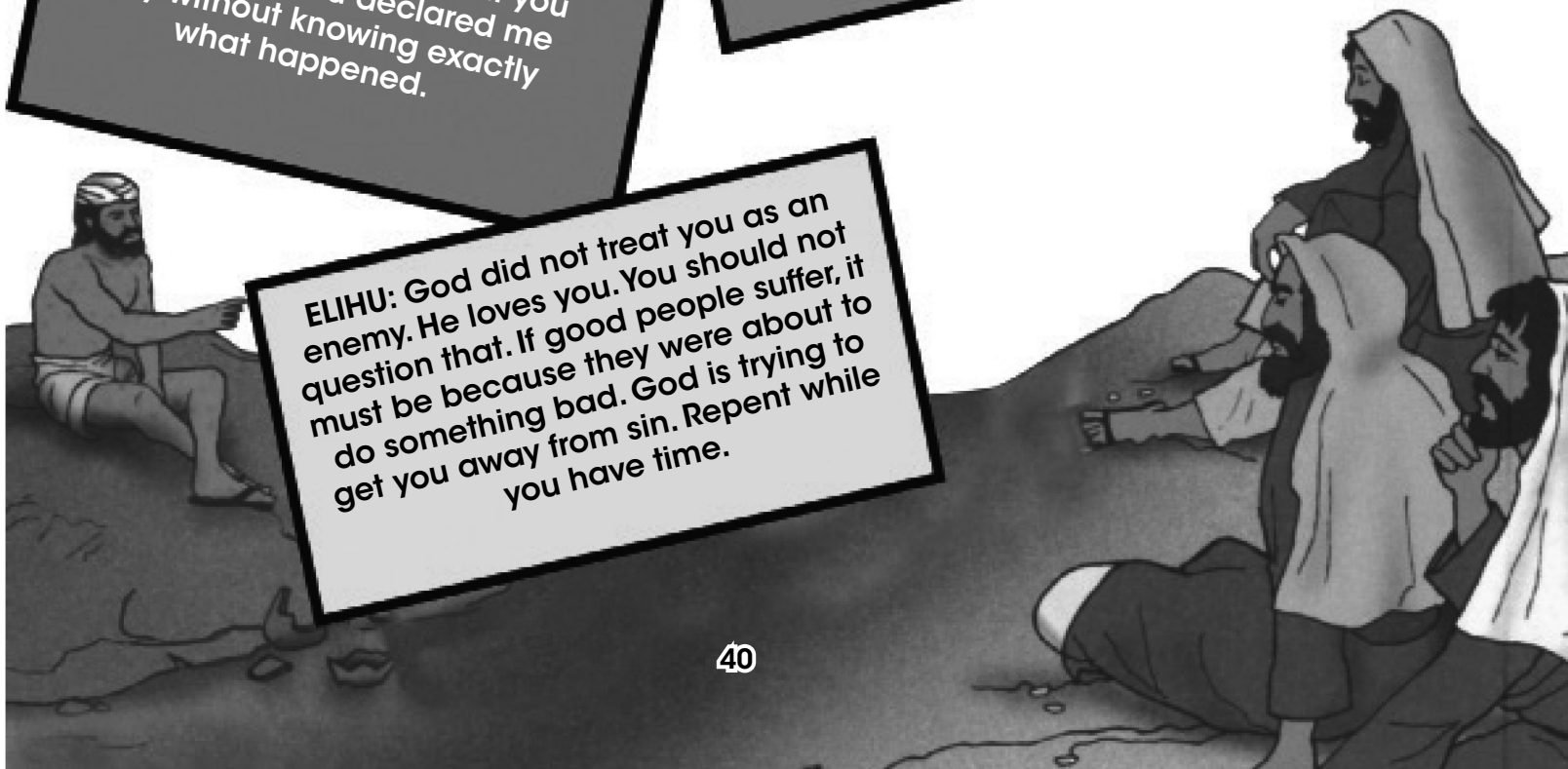
ZOPHAR: I also think that you sinned. Otherwise, God would not have allowed this to happen to you. You must confess your sin and restore your relationship with God.

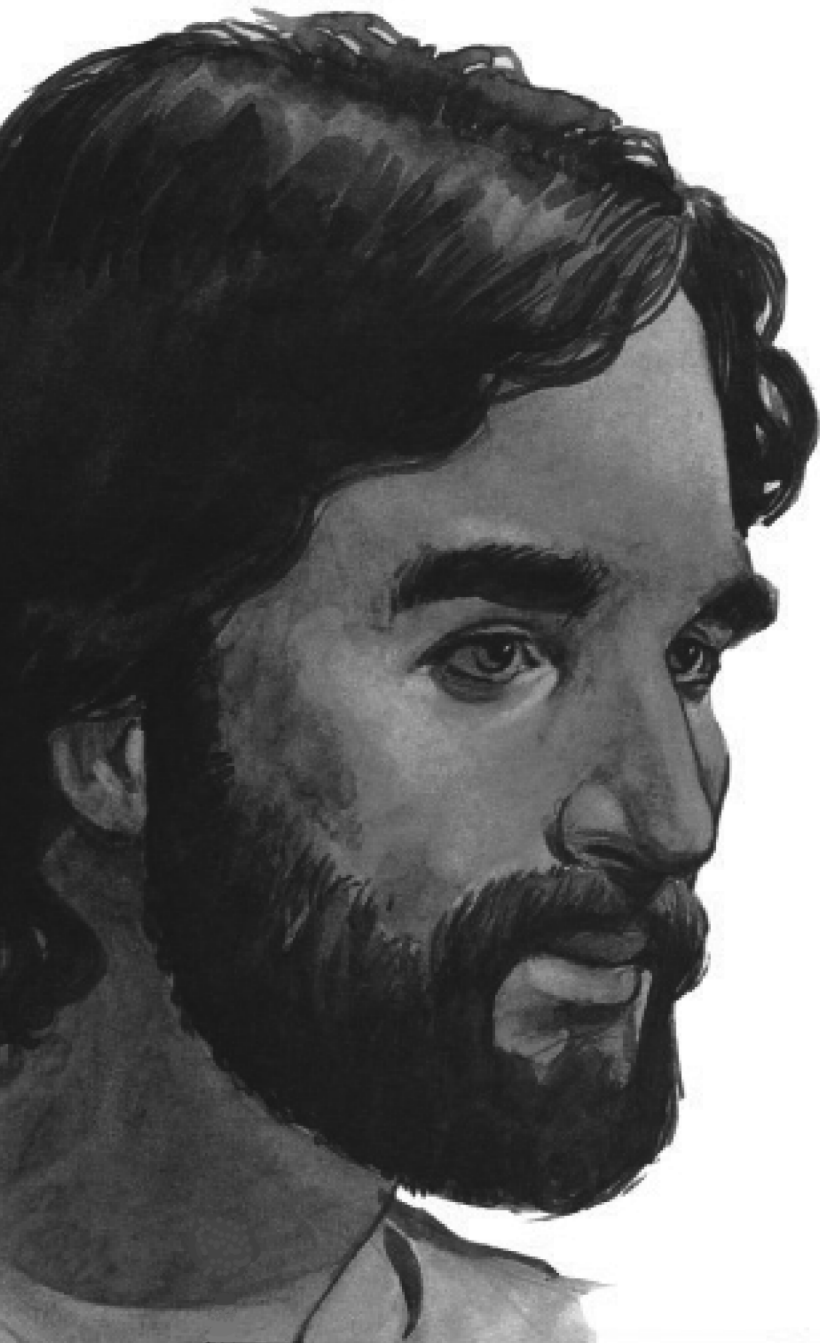

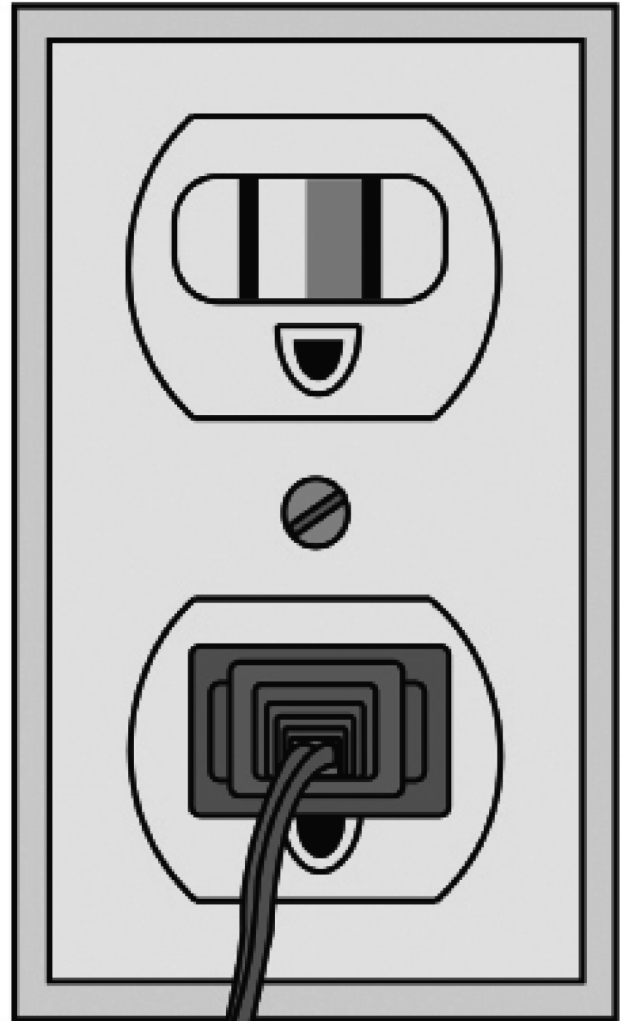

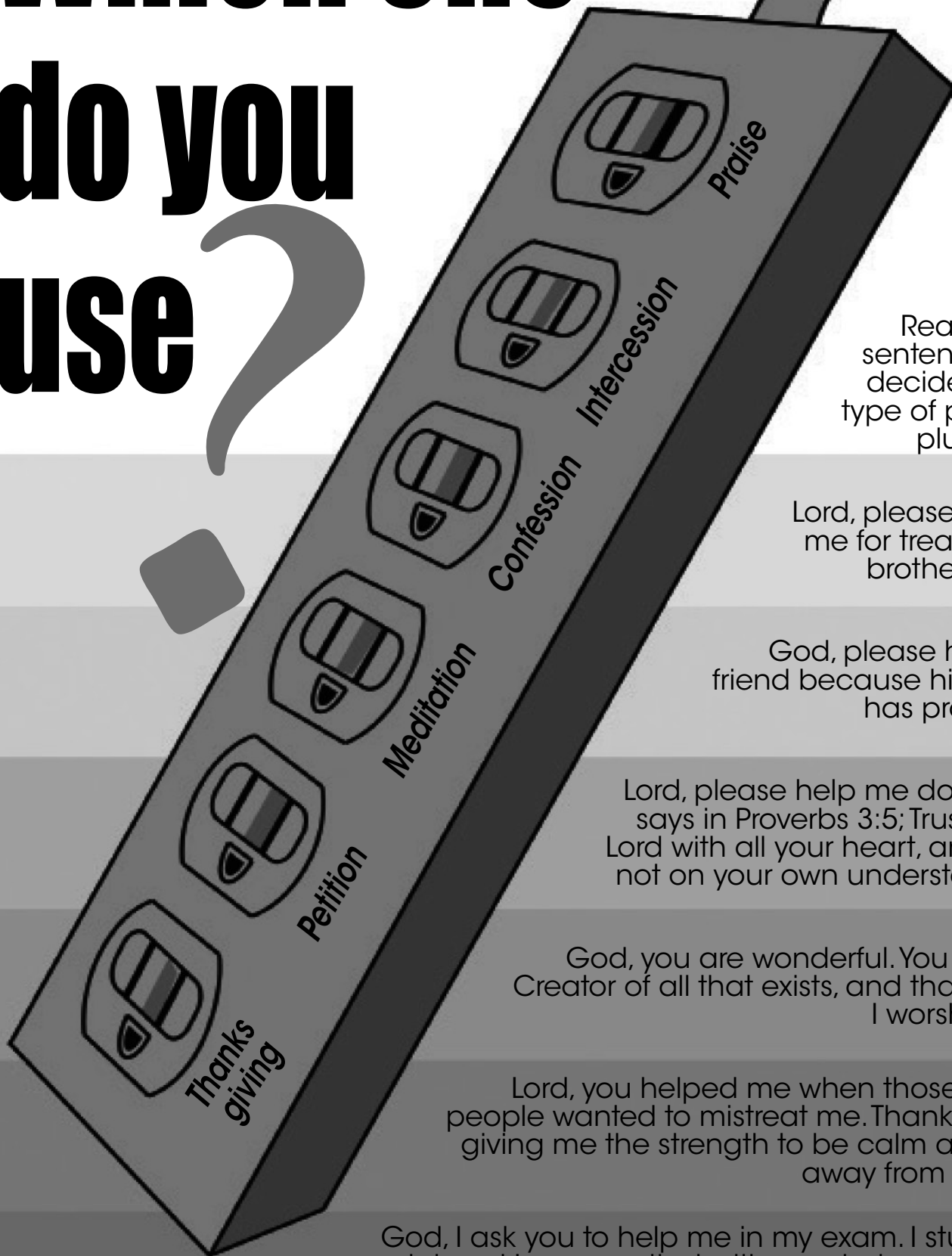

Part 1: Judgment by Annas and Caiaphas

Characters: Narrator, Jesus, Annas, Caiaphas, witnesses, chief priest, Sanhedrin.

Narrator: Jesus was arrested in the garden of Gethsemane, where he had been praying. The soldiers took him to Annas, the ex-high priest, who was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, the new high priest.

Annas: Who are those men who follow you? What lies did you tell them so that they would believe in you?

Jesus: I spoke openly and always taught in the synagogues or at the temple. I didn't say anything in secret. Why are you asking me? Wouldn't it be better ask those who heard me?

Chief Priest: (Hitting Jesus) Is that the way you answer the high priest?

Jesus: If I said something wrong, tell me, but if I told the truth, why did you hit me?

Narrator: After listening to him, Annas sent him tied up to Caiaphas.

In the house of Caiaphas, the Sanhedrin were assembled. These leaders sought to find any evidence against Jesus. Many wanted to sentence him to death. The problem was there was no reason to kill him, although false witnesses had told lies about him.

Witnesses: This man said, "I will tear down this temple made by hand, and in three days I will build another not made by hand."

Caiaphas: Do you have something to say?

Narrator: Jesus was silent.

Caiaphas: Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed One?

Jesus: I am. And you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Mighty One and coming on the clouds of heaven.

Caiaphas: (Tearing his robe) Blasphemy! We do not need any more witnesses. You yourselves have heard the blasphemy. What do you think?

Chief Priest: He's guilty! The punishment must be death!

Narrator: Then they began to spit on Jesus' face and hit him with their fists.

Chief Priest: Tell us, who hit you? Show us that you are the Messiah and tell us who hit you.

Part 2: Trial before Pilate

Characters: Narrator, Pilate, Jesus, temple officials, crowd.

Narrator: It was very early in the morning when they took Jesus before Pilate.

Pilate: What are you accusing this man of?

Chief Priest: He is guilty. We would not have brought him before you if we were not sure that he is a criminal.

Pilate: Then judge him by your own laws.

Chief Priest: We can not sentence him to death, but it is the punishment he deserves for his crimes. He is destroying our nation, and betraying Rome because he incites the people not to pay their

TRIAL

taxes to Caesar. In addition, he claims to be the Christ, the king of the Jews.

Narrator: Meanwhile, Jesus remained silent.

Pilate: Are you the King of the Jews?

Jesus: Is that what you think or did others tell you about me?

Pilate: Your people and chief priests delivered you to me. What did you do?

Jesus: My kingdom is not of this world; if it were my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jewish leaders; But my kingdom is not from here.

Pilate: So, are you king?

Jesus: You say I'm a king. For this I was born and for this I have come to the world to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me.

Pilate: What is the truth? (Pilate leaves to talk to the Jews) I find no basis for a charge against him.

Narrator: It was customary for a prisoner to be released at the time of Passover.

Pilate: Do you want me to free the King of the Jews?

Crowd: No, not him! We want Barabbas!

Narrator: Barabbas was imprisoned for inciting a rebellion in the city, and for murder.

Pilate: Whip Jesus! Maybe with that they remain calm.

Narrator: The soldiers, obeying Pilate's order, whipped Jesus until blood spilled from his back. Some soldiers made a crown of thorns and put it on Jesus.

Pilate: Jesus is innocent. I do not find any fault in him.

Crowd: Crucify him! Crucify him!

Pilate: You take him and crucify him, because I find no basis for a charge against him.

Chief Priests: We have a law, and

according to that law he must die because he claimed to be the Son of God.

Pilate: (Addressing Jesus) Where are you from? Do you refuse to talk to me? Do you not realize that I have the power to set you free or to crucify you?

Narrator: Pilate was looking for a way to set him free.

Jesus: You would have no authority over me if it were not given to you from above.

Chief Priests: If you let this man go, you are no friend of Caesar. Anyone who claims to be a king opposes Caesar.

Pilate: Here you have your King!

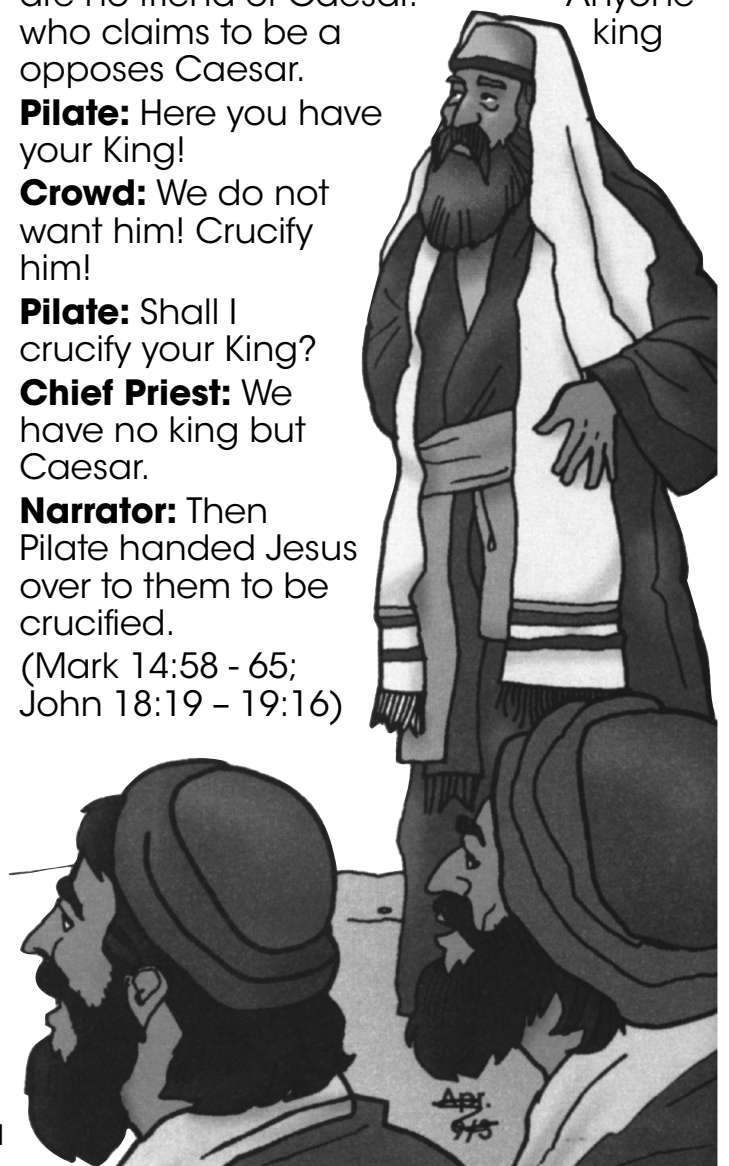
Crowd: We do not want him! Crucify him!

Chief Priest: We have no king but Caesar.

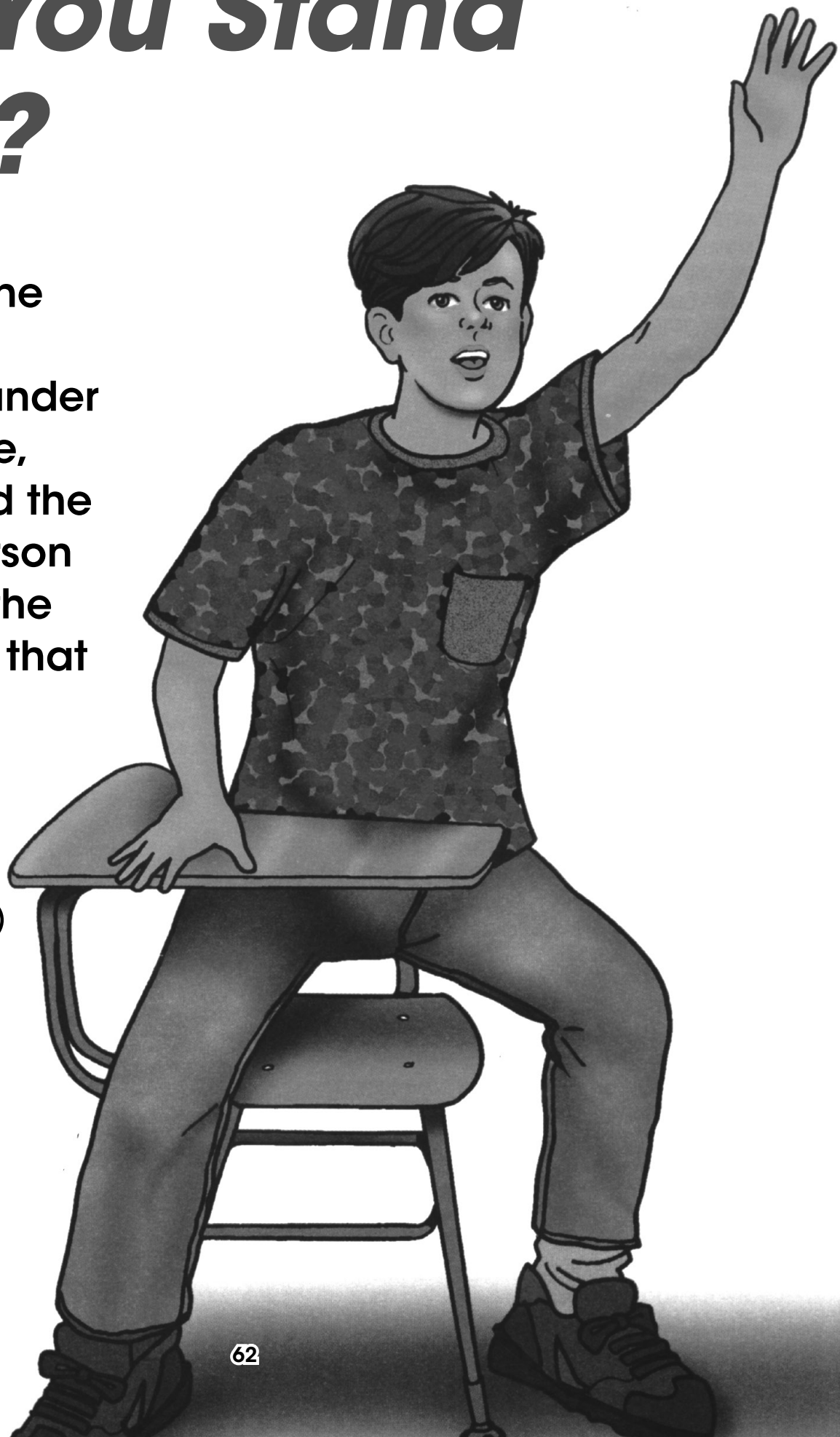
Narrator: Then Pilate handed Jesus over to them to be crucified.



What Would You Sacrifice for Your Sins?



In Old Testament times, people offered sacrifices to express gratitude to God or to ask for forgiveness. The first animal sacrifice was to cover the sin of Adam and Eve. Although the people in the Old Testament also brought grain offerings, it was common to sacrifice an animal.

The prophets warned the people that sacrifices were not enough if they did not love and obey God. The sacrifices of the Old Testament announced the way in which Jesus would die.

John writes in the New Testament. "My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have an advocate with the Father—Jesus Christ, the Righteous One. He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world." (1 John 2:1-2)

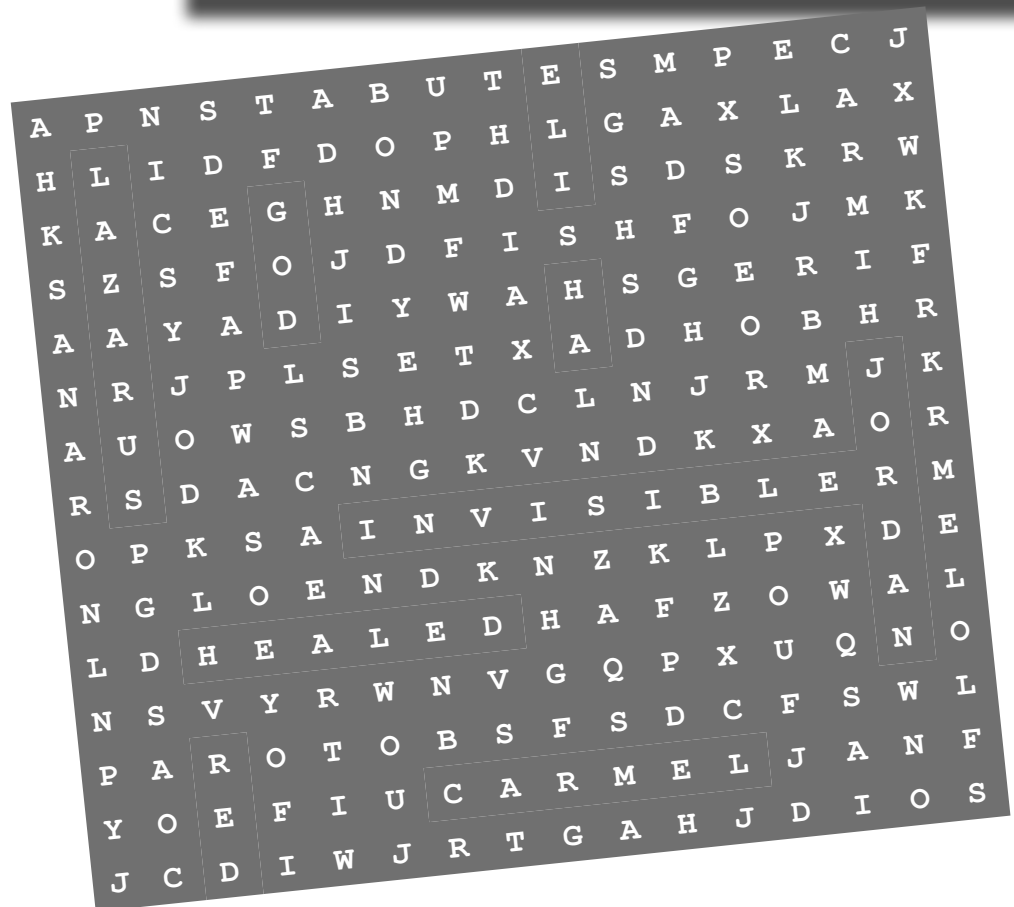

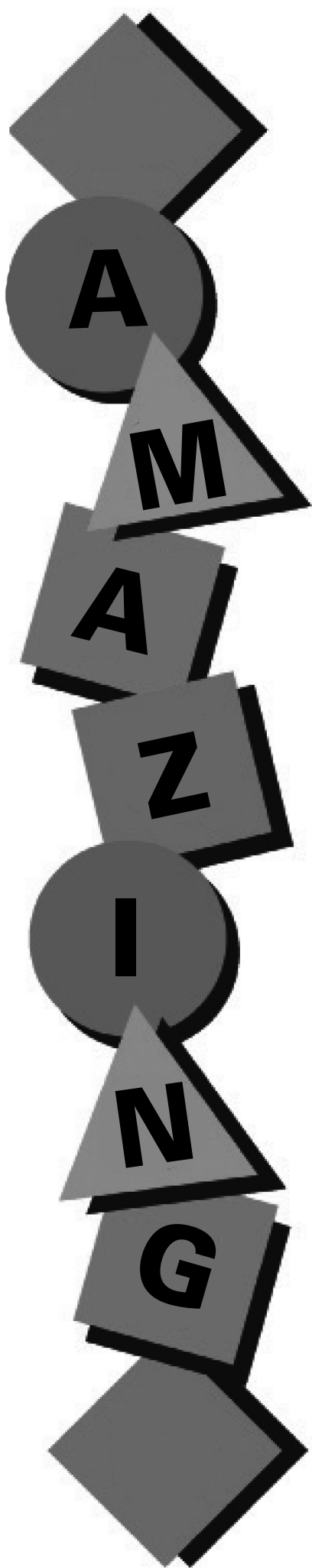

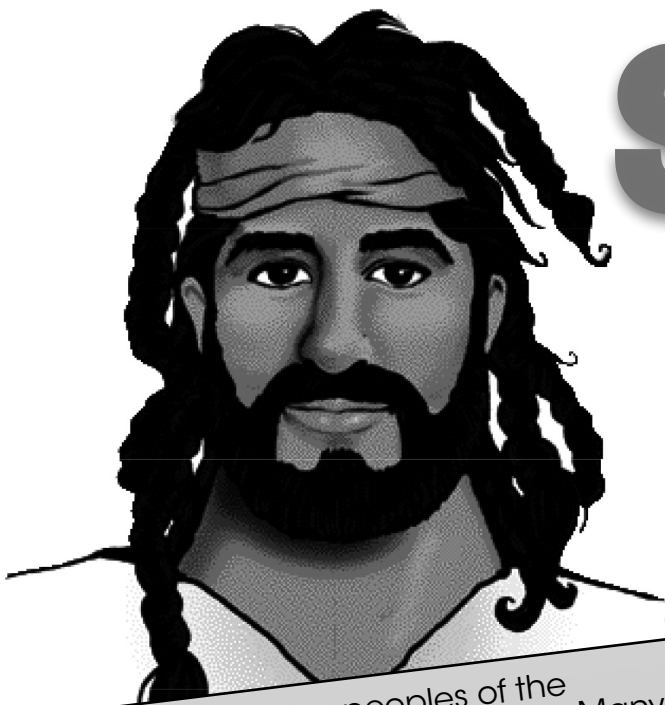

Samson

The neighboring peoples of the Israelites worshiped false gods. Many Israelite children, when they grew up, wanted to imitate them. They made images, put them in their courtyards and bowed before them to worship them.

As people turned away from God, he allowed them to have problems. In the coastal area lived the Philistines, who were cruel and strong. For 40 years they dominated the tribes of Israel that lived nearby. The Philistines worshiped the god Dagon. This idol had a man's face and hands, and the body of a fish. The Philistines built a great temple for Dagon in their capital city.

However, not all Israelites worshiped false gods. Some loved and served God. Among them was Manoah and his wife, an elderly couple who had no children.

One day, an angel told Manoah's wife: "You are barren and childless, but you are going to become pregnant and give birth to a son. Now see to it that you drink no wine or other fermented drink and that you do not eat anything unclean. You will become pregnant and have a son whose head is never to be touched by a razor because the boy is to be a Nazirite, dedicated to God from the womb. He will take the lead in delivering Israel from the hands of the Philistines."

When she told Manoah about this, he prayed: "Pardon your servant, Lord. I beg you to let the man of God you sent to us

come again to teach us how to bring up the boy who is to be born."

God heard Manoah and when his wife was out in the field, the angel returned, so she ran to call her husband. Manoah asked the angel, "When your words are fulfilled, what is to be the rule that governs the boy's life and work?"

The angel replied, "Your wife must do all that I have told her."

Then Manoah and his wife offered a sacrifice to God. When the flame ascended from the altar to heaven, Manoah and his wife saw the angel of the Lord rise in the flame.

After a while, Manoah's wife gave birth to a son and named him Samson. His parents raised him according to the Nazirite vows. They never cut his hair; they did not allow him to eat unclean food or drink any kind of wine. These were some of the restrictions that the Nazirites had to fulfill. Samson grew strong and God blessed him. (Judges 13:2-24)

The New Testament tells us about another Nazirite man.

Zechariah had left his home in the mountains to fulfill his time of service as a priest in the temple. Since there were many priests, they took turns ministering.

Zechariah and his wife Elizabeth loved and served God, and awaited the coming of the Messiah, but they had no children.

Twice a day Zechariah would take burning coals from the altar and take them to the sanctuary to offer incense to God. One day, when entering the sanctuary, Zechariah saw an angel and was afraid.

The angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to call him John. He will be a joy and delight to you, and many will rejoice because of his birth, for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to drink wine or other fermented drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even before he is born. He will bring back many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. And he will go on before the Lord, in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the parents to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous—to make ready a people prepared for the Lord."

It seemed incredible to Zechariah what the angel was saying, so he asked, "How will I know this? Because I am old and my wife is old."

The angel replied, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to tell you this good news. And now you will be silent and not able to speak until the day this happens, because you did not believe my words."

Those who were in the courtyard of the temple wondered why Zechariah took so long in the sanctuary. When at last he came out, he could not speak. He communicated by making signs. Then they realized that he had seen a vision. When he completed his ministry, he went home. Later, his wife Elizabeth conceived and gave birth to a boy.

According to Jewish custom, the father named his son eight days after birth. That day, relatives and friends arrived, hoping that the boy would be given his father's name.

When Elizabeth announced that the baby would be called John, they all looked at Zechariah to see his reaction. But he wrote on a tablet: "His name is John."

Immediately he regained his speech and praised God. Then, he prophesied that his son would go before the Lord to prepare the way. John would teach the people that they could be saved if they repented of their sins.

He grew big and strong. And when he was almost 30 years old, he left home and began to preach next to the Jordan River. People from all over came to hear him, and he baptized those who repented of their sins. One day, John had the privilege of baptizing Jesus. Because he baptized people, they called him John the Baptist. (Luke 1:13-24, 57)

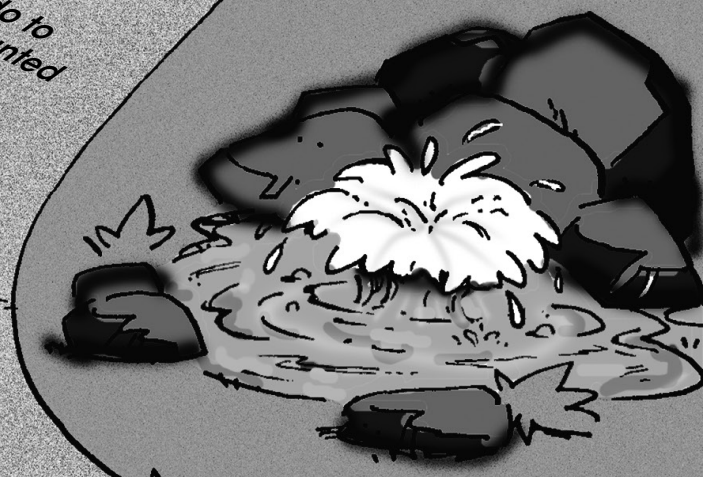
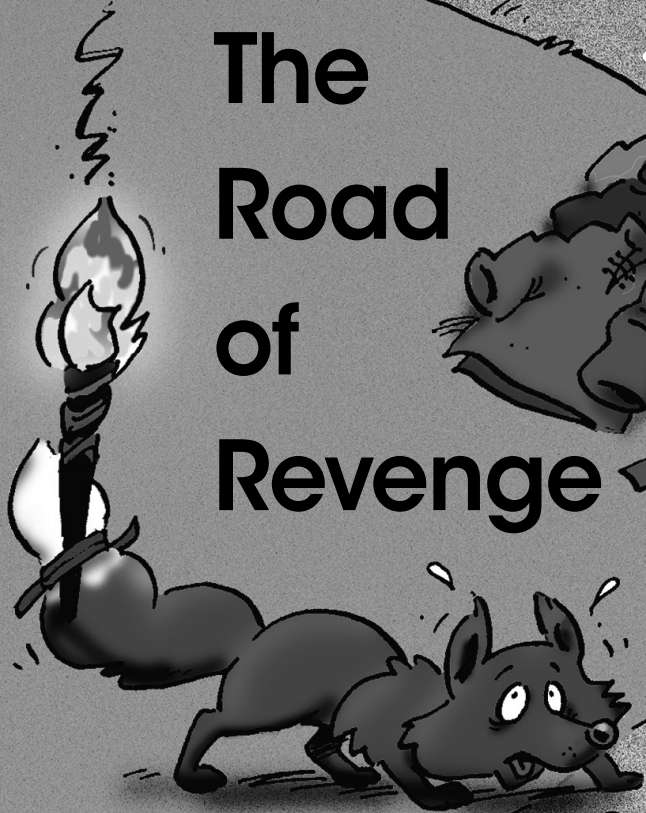

Samson: If you tie me tightly with new ropes that no one has used, then I will become as weak as any other man.

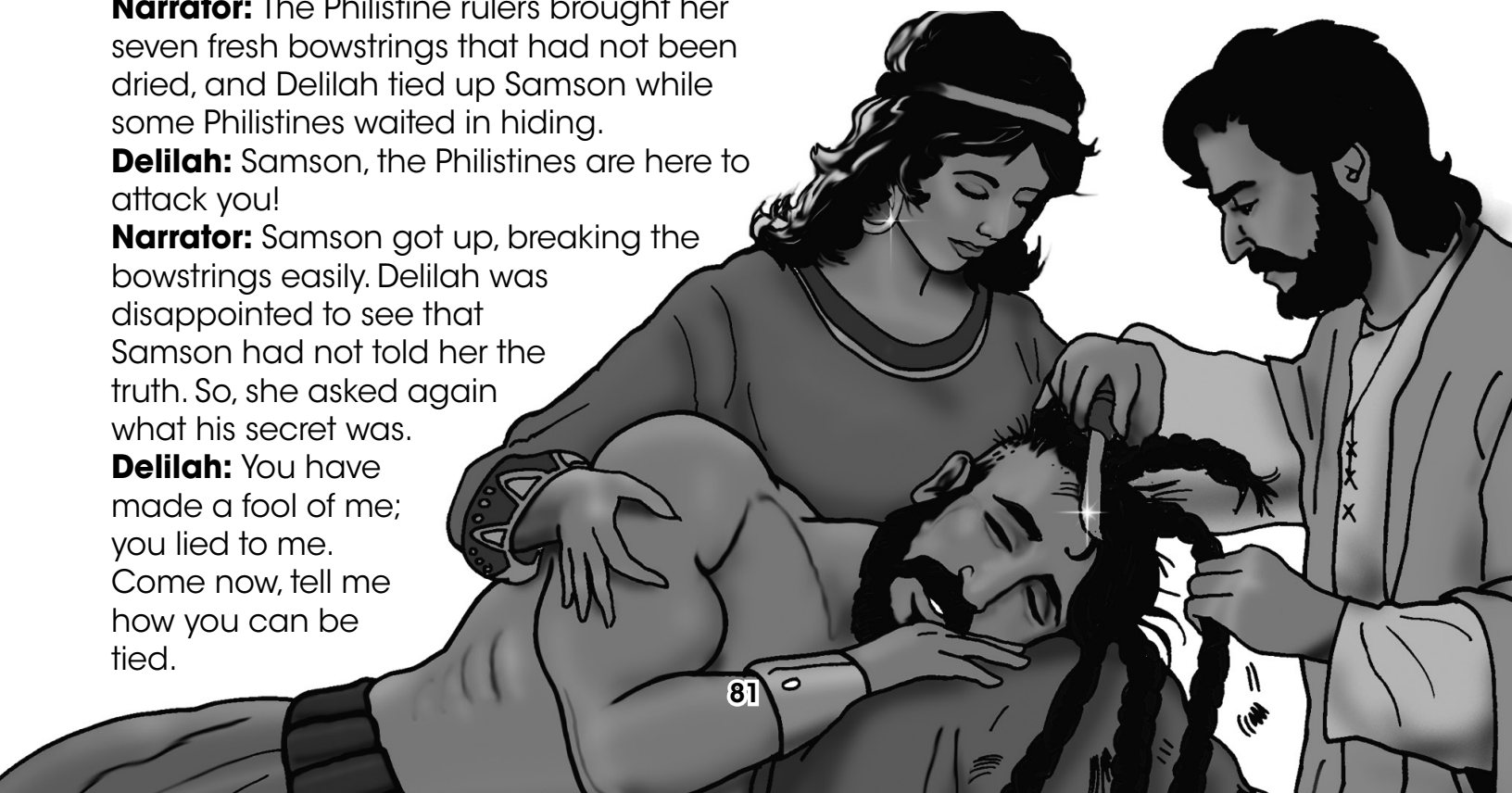
Narrator: Delilah tied Samson with new ropes and, like the first time, the Philistines were hiding in the next room.

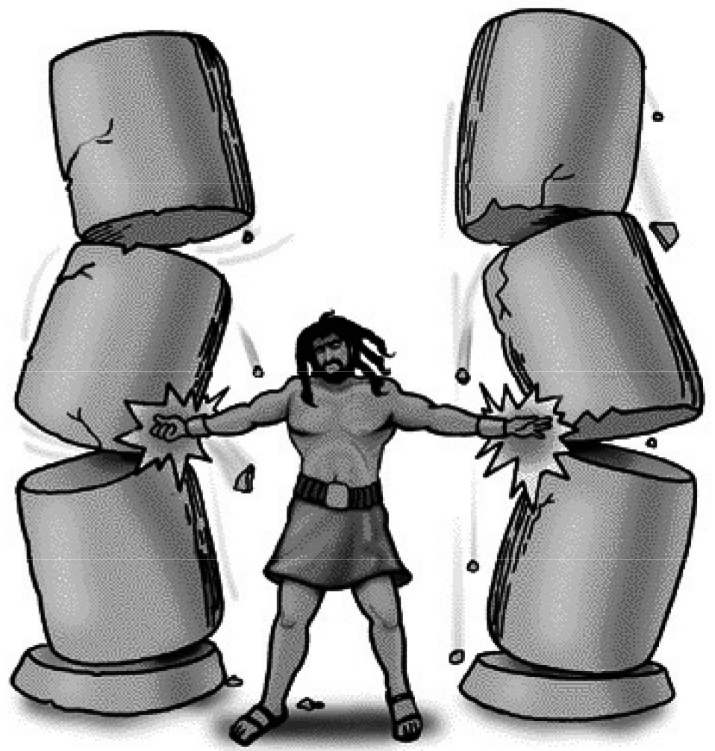

Narrator: This time the strength had abandoned Samson. The Philistines captured him, took his eyes out and took him to Gaza. There, binding him with bronze shackles, they put him to work in the prison mill. However, his hair began to grow again.

Narrator 2: The rulers of the Philistines decided to celebrate their victory and offer sacrifices to Dagon, because they thought that their god had delivered them from their enemy, Samson.



In the middle of the celebration, they asked for Samson to be brought out to entertain them. Then they stood him among the pillars. Samson said to the young man who was guiding him:

Samson: Put me where I can feel the pillars that support the temple, so I may lean against them.

Narrator 2: The temple was full of men and women, and all the rulers of the Philistines were there. On the roof there were about three thousand people watching Samson perform.

Samson: Sovereign Lord, remember me. Please, God, strengthen me just once more, and let me with one blow get revenge on the Philistines for my two eyes.

Narrator 2: Samson reached toward the two central pillars on which the temple stood, and braced himself against them.

Samson: Let me die with the Philistines!

Narrator 2: Then he pushed with all his strength, and the temple collapsed on the Philistines and all who were there. More were killed when Samson died than he had killed in all his life. (Judges 16)

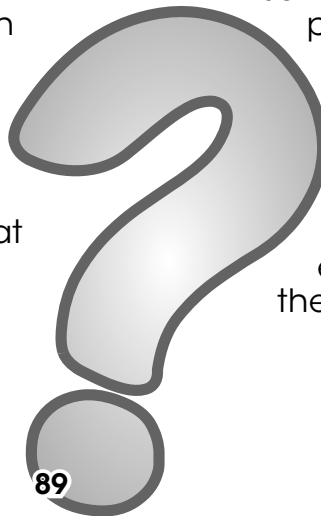
Scientific statements:

A common belief is that a "divine being" made all living beings. Since those events would be supernatural, they can not be proven scientifically; that is, we can not repeat them, control them or detect them with our senses.

There are two main hypotheses about the origin of life. One states that millions of years ago the atmosphere of the earth was very different from how it is today. Instead of being formed by oxygen and nitrogen, it is thought to have large amounts of carbon dioxide, water vapor, ammonia and methane. Perhaps the sun's rays caused these substances to combine, forming compound chemicals such as proteins. For thousands of years, these compounds grouped together, forming cells that could continue the processes of life.

The second hypothesis is that life on earth originated from meteorites, since some of these chemicals that produce proteins have been found in meteorites that have been discovered on earth.

In the past, before human beings and even dinosaurs walked the earth, there was only life in the ancient seas.

The word "image", commonly understood to mean a likeness of a person or thing to another, or a reflection or representation of such, appears numerous times in the Bible.

The divine image in man is not physical, for God is a Spirit without physical form. But He has shared that very spiritual nature with mankind. It is that quality which makes mankind unique among and superior to all other earthly creatures, giving him the ability to commune and fellowship with his Creator.

People have intellectual ability; that is, we can know, reason, imagine, remember, judge and make decisions freely.

We can reflect the moral image of God. Because of sin mankind lost its original holiness, but we can choose to ask for forgiveness and restore that relationship with God. As a Christian grows and matures, he/she better reflects the likeness of God.

Today the word "image" is often used when referring to someone's reputation. "Having a good image" of a person means to be well thought of. This can prompt Christians to be aware of the impression that their appearance and behavior have on others.

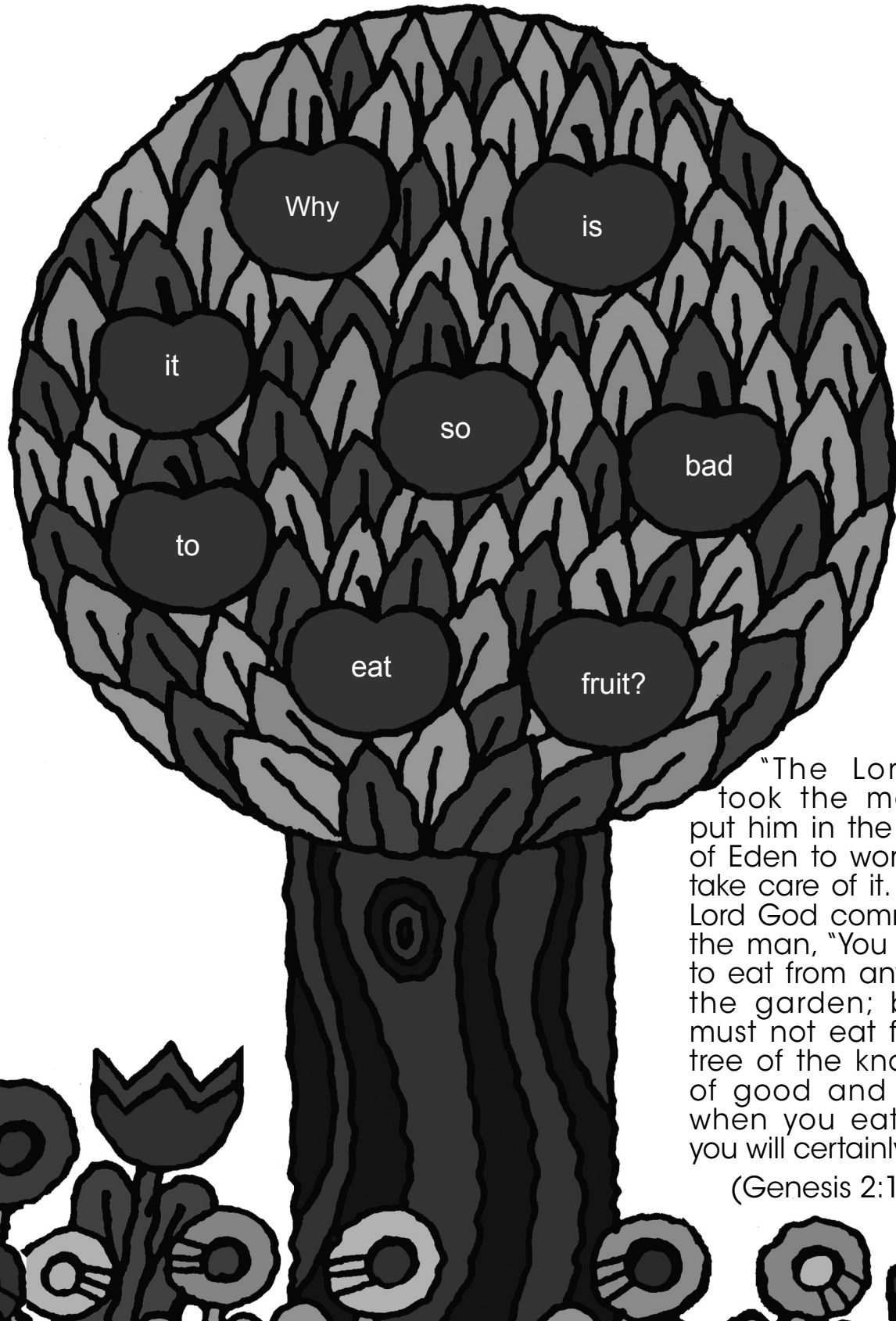

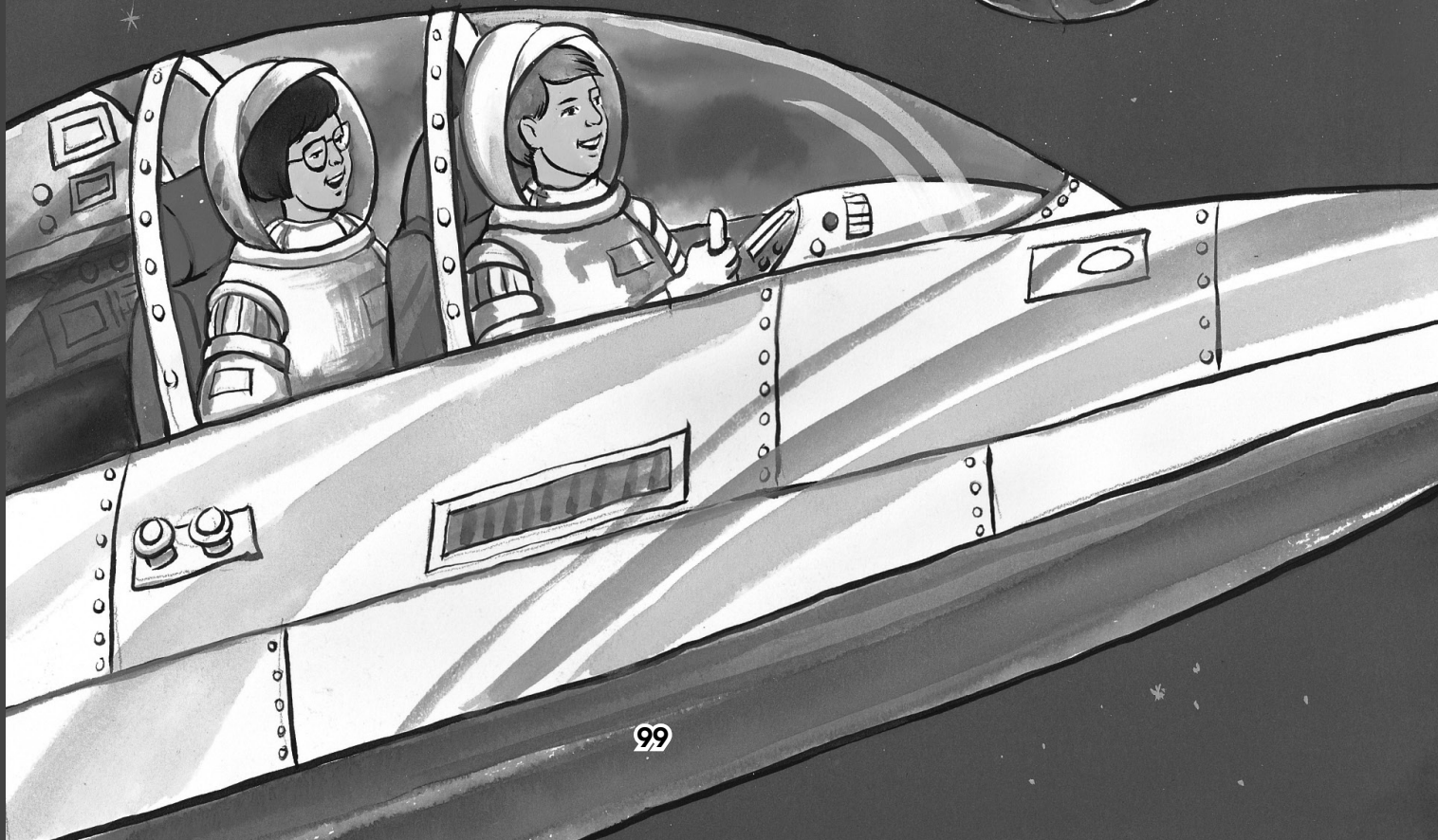
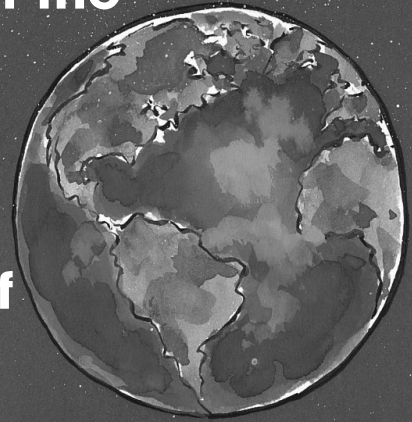

THE RESPONSIBILITY GOD HAS GIVEN MANKIND

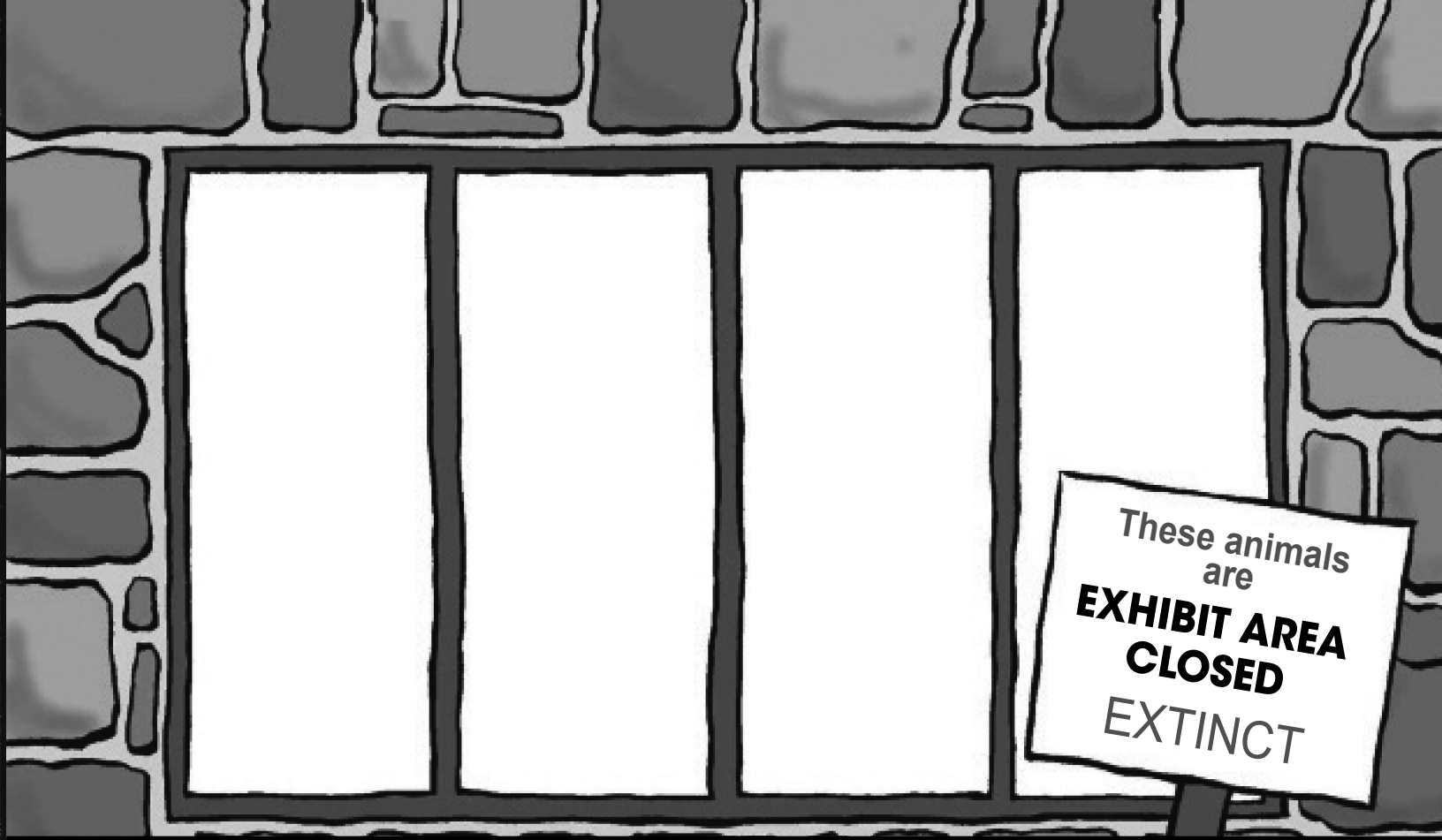

Gentile Christians agreed to accept the following Jewish requirements:

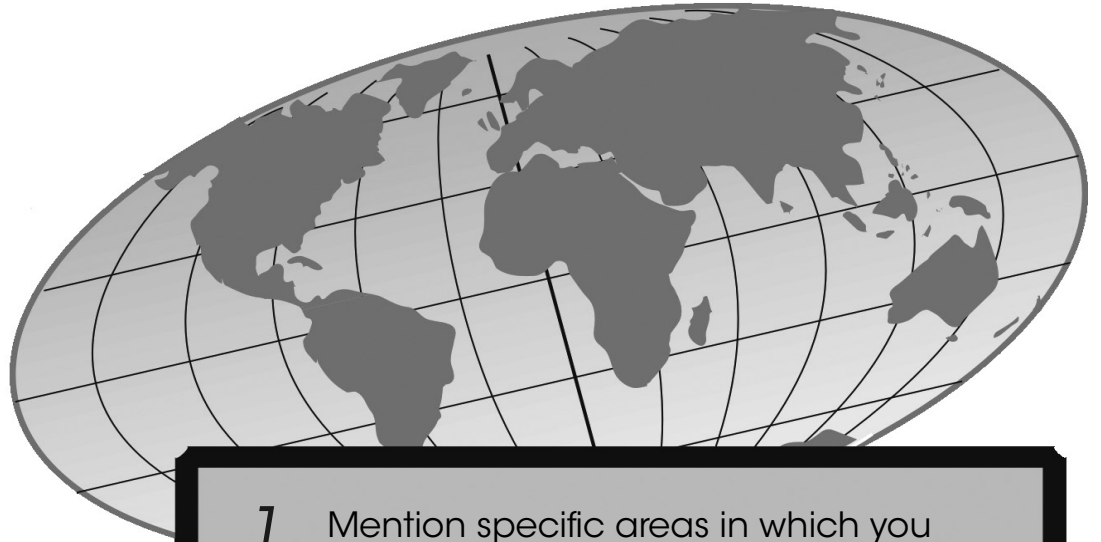
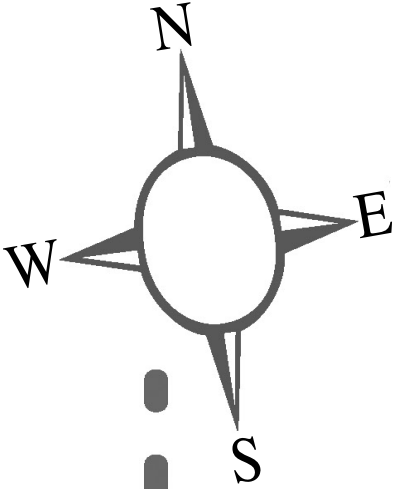
1. Refrain from food sacrificed to idols.
2. Maintain sexual purity
3. Refrain from eating meat from a strangled animal and blood.

Jewish standards are much higher than those of pagan society.

The Council sent two representatives, Judas (called Barsabbas) and Silas, with a letter explaining the decision to the Christians of Antioch. These men traveled with Paul and Barnabas.

In the church of Antioch, the message was read for all to hear, and it caused the people to rejoice. Then, Barsabbas and Silas returned to their tasks in the city of Jerusalem.

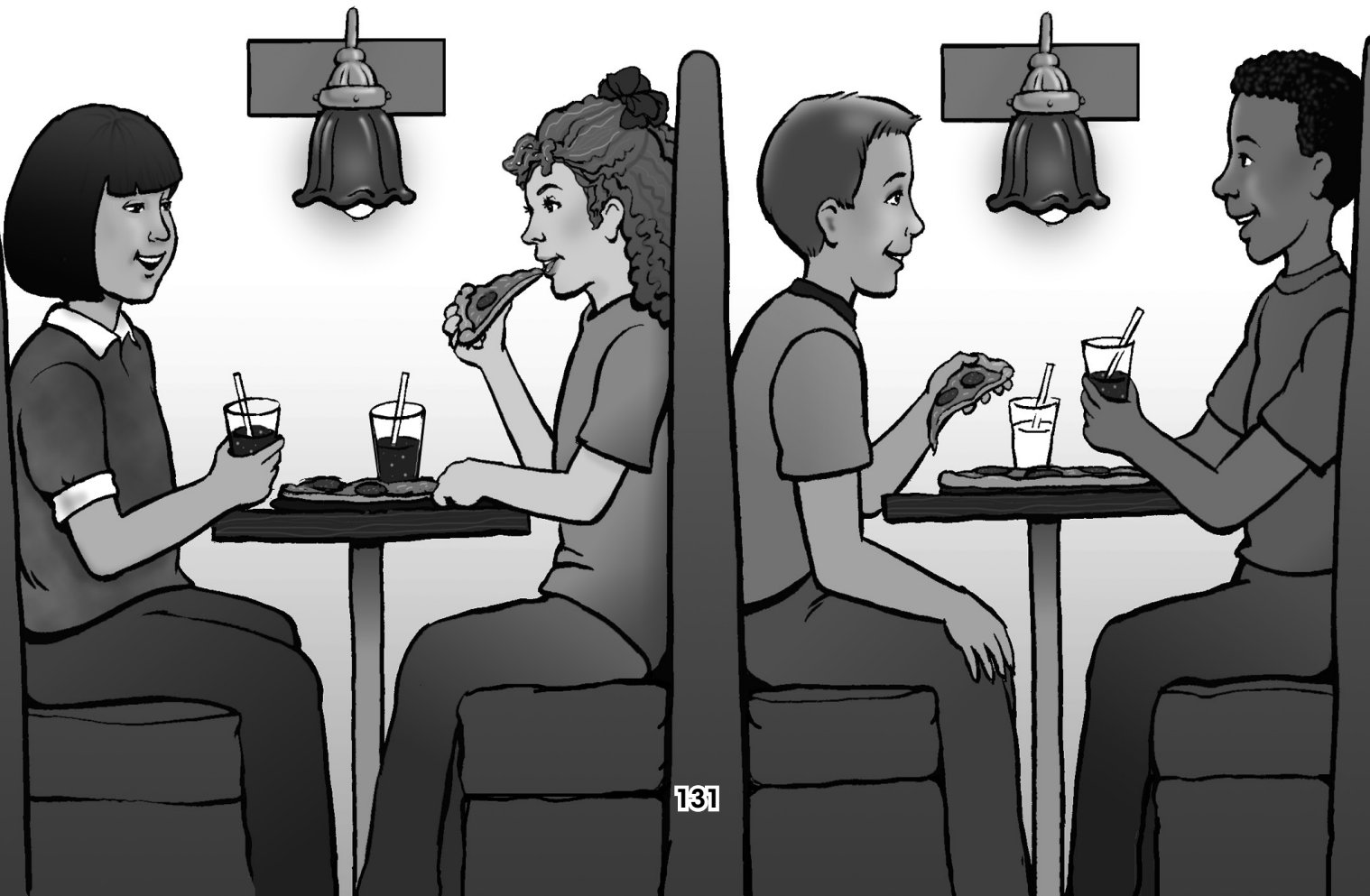

THE KING DISOBEYS GOD

HE MUST

Characters: Narrator, Saul, Samuel, Jonathan, captain of the army

Scene 1: On the battlefield.

Saul: Jonathan, we have 3,000 strong and brave warriors. I don't think we'll have any problems the next time we fight the Philistines.

Jonathan: Our informants say that there is a group of Philistines on the hill. Father, why don't we go with 1,000 soldiers and attack them? The others can stay behind in case of a surprise attack.

Saul: I think that's a good idea, Jonathan. Go and may God be with you.

Narrator: Jonathan attacked the enemy army in Gibeah. When the Philistines heard about it, they gathered their armies to fight against Israel. Saul sent word to the Israelites that they should meet at Gilgal for battle.

Scene 2: In Gilgal.

Saul: You did a good job, son, but now the Philistines are very angry. Let's go to the top of that hill. From there we can see how many have gathered in the valley.

Army Captain: King Saul, look! There must be at least 3,000 chariots and 6,000 charioteers and soldiers as numerous as the

sand on the seashore. What will we do? We can not defend ourselves with only 3,000 men.

Jonathan: Our soldiers are very scared! Some have hidden in caves and pits. And others fled!

Army Captain: Where is Samuel? He said he would come. He is supposed to offer a sacrifice to ensure that God is with us.

Saul: We can't wait! The Philistines will attack us at any moment and they will surely kill us all. I will offer the sacrifice.

Jonathan: What are you saying? Only priests can offer sacrifices.

Saul: We can not wait any longer.

Narrator: Saul began offering the sacrifice. Just as he had finished making the sacrifice, Samuel arrived.

Samuel: (sniffing the air) Smells like burned flesh.

Saul: Samuel, where were you? We waited for you for a long time. The Philistines are ready to attack us and my soldiers were scattering in fear. That's why I went ahead and offered the sacrifice without you to ask for God's help.

WAIT!

Samuel: Saul, what foolishness! If you had obeyed God, one of your descendants would have been king after you. Now even you will not stay on the throne for long.

Narrator: Some time later, God commanded Saul to fight against the Amalekites. He told him to destroy all their possessions so that nothing contaminated the Israelites.

Scene 3: After the battle with the Amalekites

Army Captain: King Saul, we won the battle. Hey, the king of the Amalekites is fleeing! What should we do with him?

Saul: God told me to destroy all the enemy's possessions. What a waste! I think the best thing is to take the king as a prisoner. Why don't we also take the best of the cattle? I do not think we should kill their animals; let's keep them for ourselves and we will become richer.

Narrator: The next morning Samuel went to Saul's camp to find out what had happened in the battle.

Saul: (showing off to Samuel) We won, Samuel! I did everything that God commanded me.

Samuel: Why do I hear so much noise? It seems like the bleat of sheep and the bellowing of cows.

Saul: Well, we brought the best of the Amalek sheep and cows ... but only to offer them as a sacrifice to God!

Narrator: Samuel knew that Saul was lying. God had already anticipated it.

Samuel: Do not say anything else! Last night God told me that you had disobeyed him. Now I see with my eyes what you have done. Don't you know that God prefers your obedience over your sacrifices? This is a warning: because you did not listen to God, you will not be king for long.



How do people try to compensate for the bad things they do?

The next day, Rick arrived earlier than everyone and put the book in its place. When the teacher saw that it was damaged, he got angry and asked who had done it. Nobody confessed.

Rick continued thinking about the book. He had disappointed God, his teacher and himself, so he decided to volunteer to cut the grass at the church on Saturday, instead of going to play with his friend Roger. He thought maybe volunteering at church would make him feel better.

How long did the people wait?



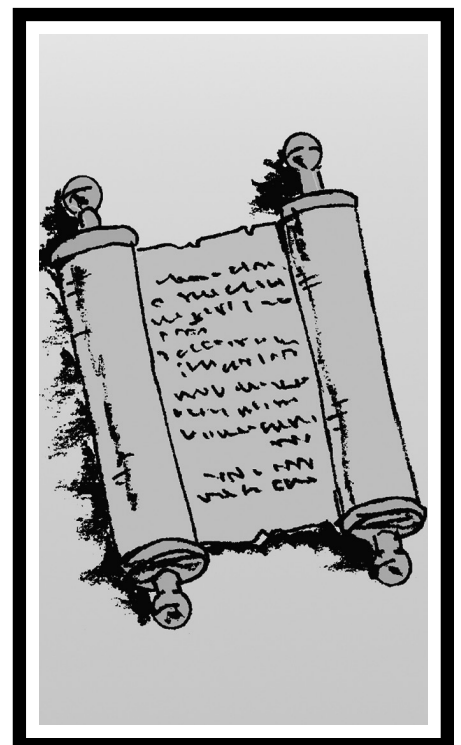
Since the creation of the world, God in his love wanted to have communion with people. When Adam and Eve disobeyed, everything changed. Sin brought as a consequence the need for a Savior. Genesis 3:5 is considered the first prophecy that suggests God's plan to send a special Savior.

Because of the terrible sin of the people, God sent a flood. However, he saved Noah and his family. God spoke with Abraham and promised him that he would bless the whole world through him. Joseph and Mary, Jesus' parents, were descendants of Abraham.

God always cared for his people. He freed them from slavery in Egypt. Then he gave them laws so they would know how they should live. The law showed people their disobedience, and that they could not save themselves.

When the people of God disobeyed, he sent prophets to admonish them. Then, he sent enemy armies to invade them as a way to punish them. Along with the warnings, God made promises of freedom. The prophets told the people that God would send a Messiah or Savior.

After the people of God returned from exile, they spent 400 years without prophets. They only had the promises that God had made years before. Some forgot the promises and stopped trusting in God. However, many continued to wait for the promised Messiah.



When Jesus was born, the kingdom of Herod the Great had had peace for a generation. The Jews only took care of their daily responsibilities and their religious rituals.

Taxes were high, but the land was productive. Farmers provided food for large cities; the Sea of Galilee provided a growing fishing industry, and many men worked on Herod's construction projects.

Caesar Augustus brought stability to the Roman Empire. The land and sea routes provided safer travel and communication between the large cities. The emperor supervised, in person, the construction and maintenance of 95,000 kilometers of roads.

Greek was the common language, and the Romans tolerated the practice of different religions. There was a new legal system, and everyone was forced to submit. Officials collected taxes to keep the government functioning.

Nobody knows why God chose that moment to send Jesus. On a human level, it seemed ideal. There was a common language, the routes made it much easier to spread the news quickly. There was an organized form of communication. The government was stable and tolerant of religious ideas. Whatever the reason, God decided it was the right time.

The Chamber of Commerce will meet in two weeks to decide if it is necessary to build more shelters.

Because of the housing problem, the baby's parents sought refuge in a stable and the baby was born there. They are using a manger as a bed. The mother and the baby are in good health.



EXPECTED TAX INCREASE
